

Using satellite imagery to understand the benefits that marine nature reserves provide to society: photographs taken during the saltmarsh valuation workshop

Summary

This document is an image-based summary of the workshop undertaken for the identification of saltmarsh sub-features and societal benefits as part of the Valuing Nature Placement scheme with The Wash and North Norfolk Marine Partnership, Institute of Estuarine and Coastal Studies, University of Hull and Marine Conservation Society. The workshop was held at Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust's Gibraltar Point Visitors Centre on February 20th 2018. The outputs from the workshop will all be digitised once the assessment of the other sites on The Wash and North Norfolk coast are complete.
